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# Tech Sisters is a community for Muslim women in tech, where shared stories, experiences, and goals remind us we're not alone.

Tech Sisters began in 2019 with a mission to support Muslim women in feeling seen and validated so that they can build fulfilling careers in tech. Guided by our core values of deen, sisterhood, transparency, collaboration, and giving back, we evaluate our progress through our annual Community Health Report.

Every December, we conduct a comprehensive survey across three key themes to measure our health and impact as a community: Values, Activity, and Belonging. Our response rate this year was 12%, or 77 people, our highest yet. For further details on the survey methodology, please refer to our 2021 and 2022 reports.

## **Reflections over the last year**

Compiling this year's report has been an emotionally charged experience. On the one hand, the heartfelt testimonials and positive metrics confirm we're making great strides in supporting and engaging our members. However, at the administrative level, 2023 was a particularly challenging year. Team capacity became overstretched, requiring a strategy reassessment and temporarily suspending initiatives that were making an insufficient impact relative to their cost in time and energy,

like the podcast and Mentor Match program.

Furthermore, more members faced job struggles in 2023 than ever before, with layoffs, revoked offers, and hiring freezes becoming common. The support needed went beyond practical things like CV advice and interview tips. It touched on the core of being a Tech Sister: emotional support and validation from women who understand because they're going through the same struggles.

Finally, in a way that's extremely difficult to put into words, the ongoing crisis in Gaza is something that continues to have a profound and painful impact on our community. Every Tech Sister has been affected by this, and the community came together to support activism, share resources, and find ways to move forward.

Despite these struggles, Tech Sisters continued to grow and thrive in 2023, signalling progress towards our vision of a self-managed and self-sustaining community. Our ultimate aim is for engaged members to drive initiatives, minimising the administrative overhead.

Approaching our 5th anniversary in 2024, Tech Sisters has come incredibly far since our first newsletter in 2019. Our guiding policies and processes are resilient and ensure continued growth and effectiveness. Let's see how much more we can achieve in 2024!

# Value

## Are Tech Sisters members getting the benefits that they came for?

Our Net Promotor Score (NPS) reached a new high of 70 in 2023, pushing us into the excellent zone. That's a huge accomplishment! We also achieved higher scores in delivering benefits to our community and ease of accessing resources. Members receive clear value from being part of our community and feel very loyal and enthusiastic about being Tech Sisters!

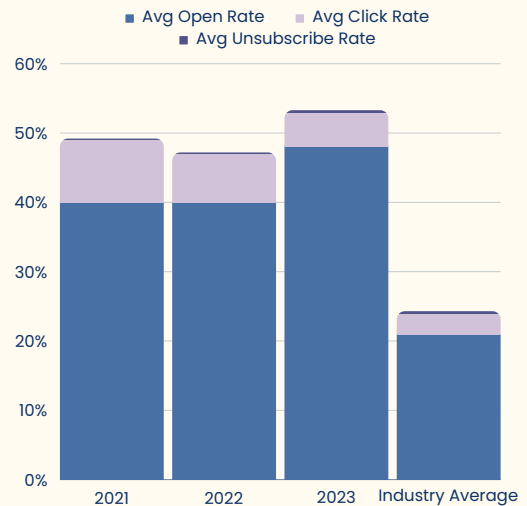


# Activity

## How are Tech Sisters members participating in our programs?

### Newsletter

During 2023, we changed newsletter providers from Mailchimp to MailerLite. Thanks to the switch, our audience grew by 160% without experiencing disruptions. Our open rate (48%) remains much higher than the industry average, and 53% of members would recommend the Tech Sisters Newsletter to others.



### Slack and Whatsapp

We introduced a new Tech Sisters private Whatsapp group in 2023 to encourage casual chats between members. Talking on Slack felt intimidating for some members, and with more people staying quiet, it looked like the community was inactive. Chatting on WhatsApp feels much more intuitive and welcoming. Slack is still the best for organising conversations, so it remains our default communication hub. The “stickiness” ratio on Slack has increased by 2% from last year, meaning monthly visitors are more likely to stay engaged every day.

The average self-evaluated activity level for Slack was 5 out of 10 and 9 out of 10 for WhatsApp. Reasons given for not participating more were lack of time, unfamiliarity with Slack, and low perceived activity. This is consistent with our findings from previous years.

# Hackathon

The standout event of 2023 was undoubtedly our first Hackathon. We knew from previous community surveys that Tech Sister members wanted a way to collaborate, learn new skills, and boost their portfolios. Twenty participants, divided into six teams with a dedicated mentor, were given a month to work on a project idea of their choice. The final projects were far beyond our expectations, not only for the technical skill and creativity they displayed but also for the beautiful and very apparent friendships that grew between the teams. The most common feedback in our community health survey was that the Hackathon was an incredible experience for everyone involved, and people want us to do it again! [2023 project gallery](#).

# Job Search Clinic

From our community data and the state of the 2023 job market, we knew that our members needed some extra support. Getting inspiration from the Never Search Alone model, we created a space where job seekers could meet twice a week and find support. During these sessions, we work on mock interviews, review CVs, invite guest speakers from the wider Tech Sisters community, and share resources.

But the most important benefit is being in the company of other women struggling with the same thing. Job seeking can be a very isolating experience, and the Job Search Clinic is a way of sharing that load with your sisters.

Tech Sisters feel heard, seen, and included as part of the Tech Sisters Community. In 2023, we've seen a 30% increase in personal engagement and a 17% increase in members making friends with each other. Based on the survey responses, this increase was due to the Hackathon and JSC.

This proves that Tech Sisters is living up to our values and is a uniquely welcoming space for Muslim women in tech. Members told us that while other professional groups can feel formal at times, Tech Sisters feels like a place to let your hair down and talk to your sisters. It feels like home.

“The diversity in Tech Sisters is very comforting, everyone is kind to one another and there's no trace of any sort of discrimination whatsoever.”

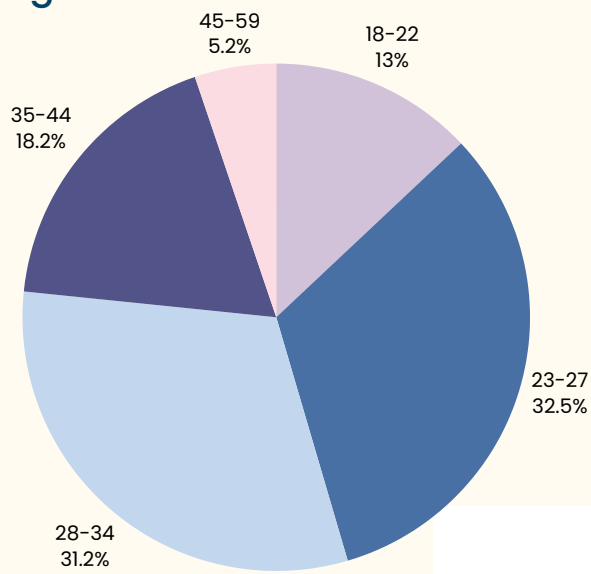
“The courtesy and help here are genuine. Although I don't engage with the group much, I feel as if this is a huge support base I can always go to when in need of help.”



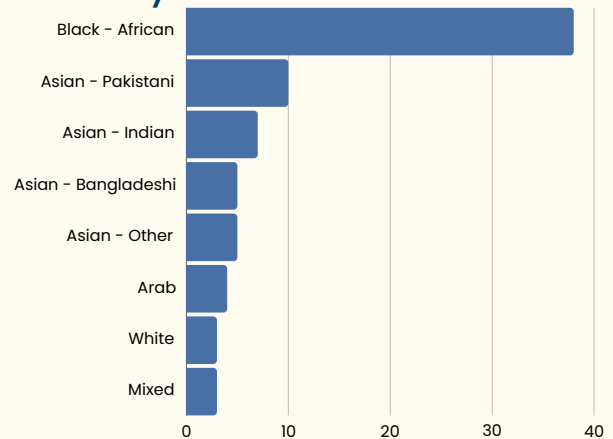

## Who are Tech Sisters?

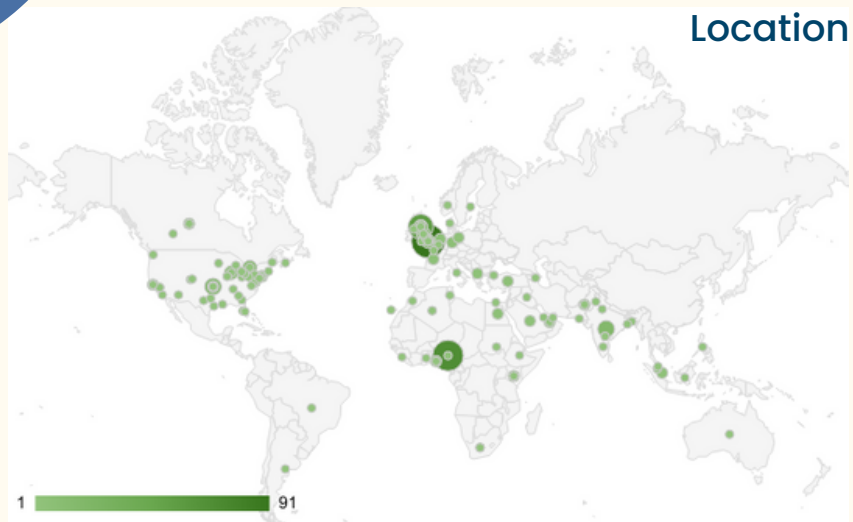
### Age

### Location

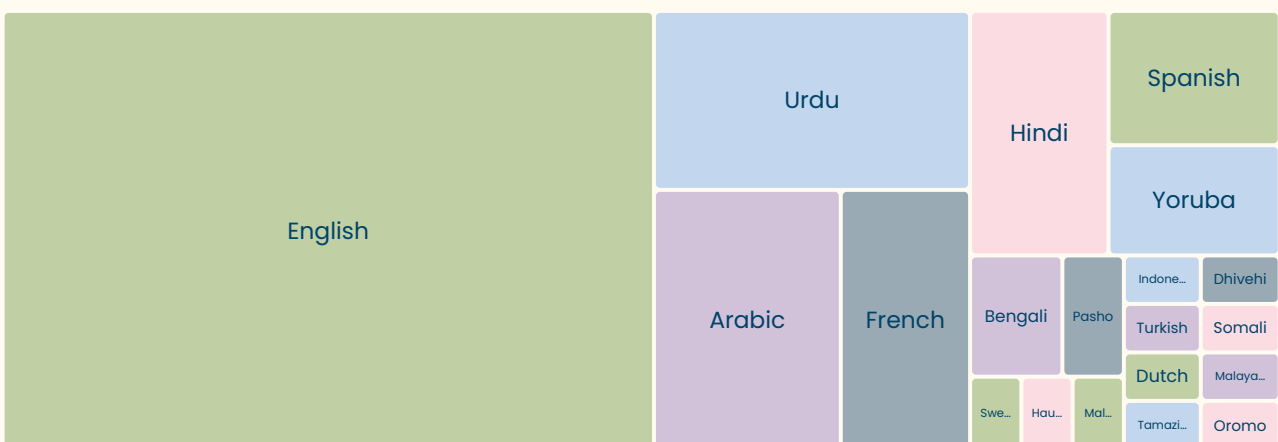

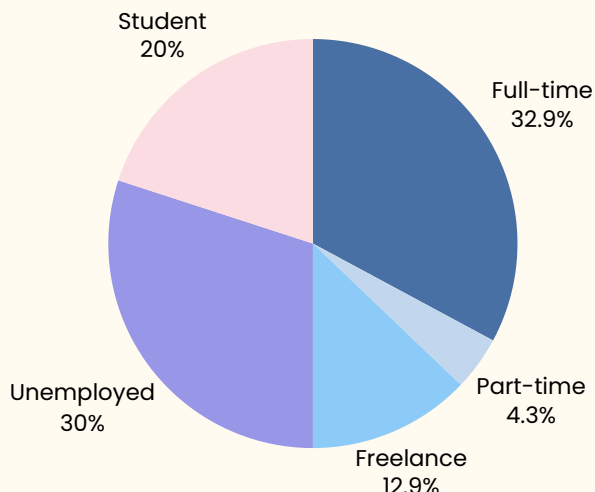


## Meet Fatima...

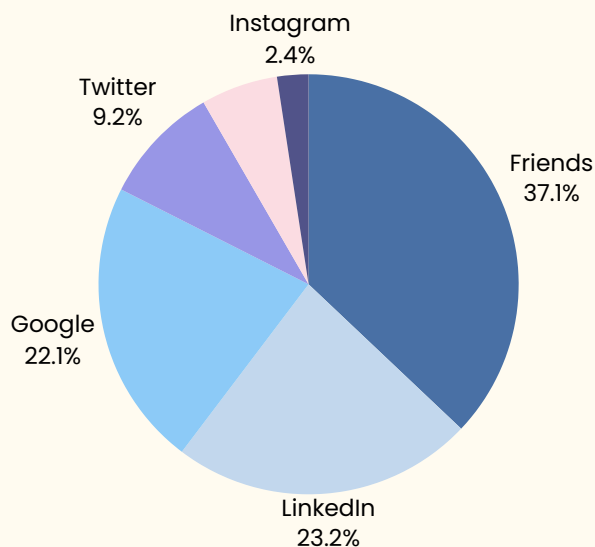

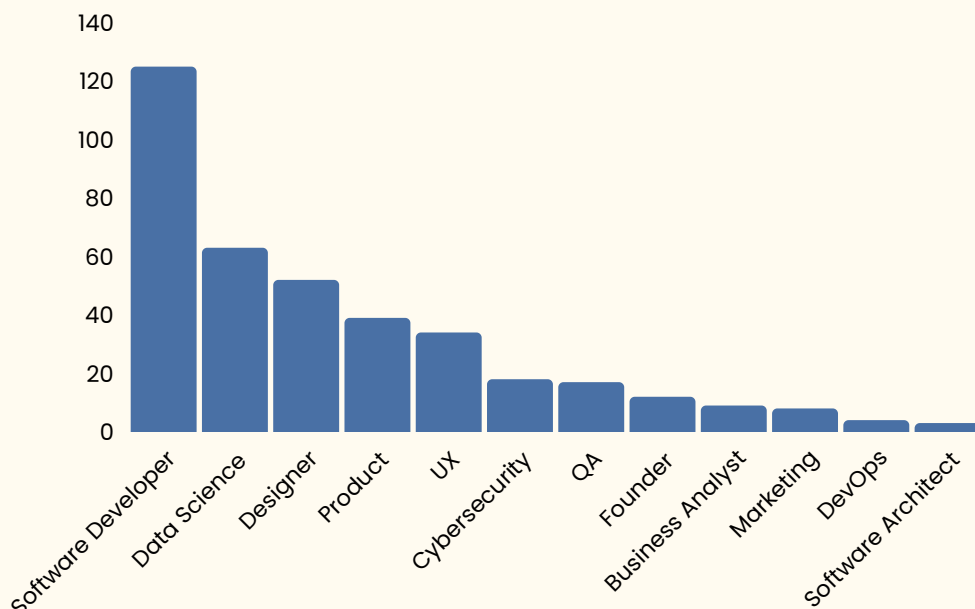
## Employment Type



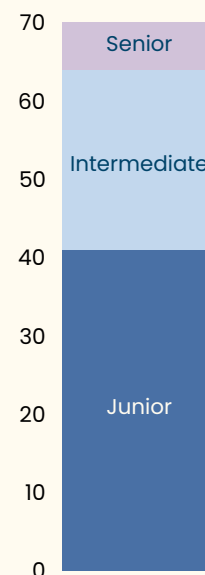
